Ridgefield, WA. — The Clark County Fair held its Queen's coronation ceremony over the weekend (April 17th), to name its Queen and Princesses for the 2010 Fair season. The Queen was crowned during the annual Queen's Court Coronation Dinner in front of over 400 participants at the fairgrounds. The Clark County Fair returns this August 6 through 15, 2010. The court will travel all over the west attending other rodeos, parades and activities representing the Clark County Fair and surrounding SW Washington communities.
