ENTRIES:

Entries for this class must be on a separate entry form. Do not include them on your Goat entry form. Entry fee is \$5.00 per animal. Request entry forms from the Fair Administration Office or download from the Clark County Fair's website: www.clarkcofair.com. Send all entry forms and fees to Fairgrounds Site Management Group (FSMG), 17402 NE Delfel Rd., Ridgefield, WA 98642. Entries must be in the Clark County Event Center at the Fairgrounds Office by Saturday, July 15, 2017, and accompanied by a non-refundable entry fee of \$5 per animal. Check should be made out to FSMG. Credit Card payment accepted at the fairgrounds office. **Entries must be in place for vet check by 7 a.m., Wednesday, August 9, 2017.**

Live animals will be weighed, tagged and judged on Wednesday, August 9th, starting at approximately 8:30 a.m. in the goat arena. Open to everyone is the Jackpot Judging Contest - \$2.00 entry fee. (Jackpot Judging Contest - only to be held if three or more goats are entered.)

Jackpot Judging: Noon (12 p.m.) Wednesday, August 9th

All exhibitors in this department are responsible for reading and complying with the **General Rules** and the special rules and regulations of this department.

RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. Exhibitors must read the General Rules document that also contains the General Animal Health Requirements, available on the Fair's website.
2. Entries for the Wednesday Fair Show will be postmarked or turned into the Clark County Fair Administration Office by Saturday, July 15, 2017.
3. **All entries must be in place by 7 a.m., Wednesday, August 9, 2017.**
4. The Class is open to all exhibitors.
5. Entry Limit – One goat per exhibitor.
6. Goats may be does or wethers, and any breed or crossbreed.
7. No bucks will be accepted.
8. No horned animals will be accepted prior to 7 a.m., Wednesday, August 9, 2017.

9. All goats must have been born after January 1, 2017.

10. Each animal must be entered and compete in both classes.

Goats will be shipped to a packing house for processing immediately following judging. Carcasses will be judged on the rail. The results will be compiled and available in the Boer Barn as soon as possible.

The owner of the goat is responsible for the killing cost. The carcass remains the property of the exhibitor. Disposition of the carcass after it is judged is the responsibility of the Exhibitor.
