4-H Shooting Sports will be exhibited in the 4-H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area in South Hall 3. Items on display must stay in the 4H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area from Friday, August 2 through Sunday, August 11, 2024. Members can pick up their exhibits after 10 pm on the last day of the Fair or the Monday following Fair from 9 am to Noon. If you are unable to be there at that time, please make arrangements to have your exhibits picked up. Some 4-H exhibits will be taken back to the 4-H Office-check first 564-397-5730.

RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. Exhibitor must be enrolled in one or more of the following the 4-H Projects:

Air Pistol, Air Rifle, Hunting Skills, Muzzleloader, Shotgun, Smallbore Pistol, Smallbore Rifle.

- 2. General/Project Leader of Exhibitor must be enrolled and be certified 4H Shooting Sport instructor in the Discipline or Project Area members are enrolled: Air Pistol, Air Rifle, Hunting Skills, Muzzleloader, Shotgun, Smallbore Pistol, Smallbore Rifle.
- 3. Shooting Sports exhibits and Riflery result/targets/ribbons will be in place for public viewing from August 2 thru August 11, 2024 in the 4-H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area in South Hall 3.
- 4. Exhibitors are required to do an hour or more of Shooting Sport Stewardship (see Division 705 Riflery Stewardship).
- 5. Members must pre-Register utilizing the Clark County Fair 4-H Shooting Sports Match Form available at WSU Clark County Extension (1919 N. E. 78 Street, Vancouver, WA). Entries must be turned in to the WSU Clark County Extension 4-H Program office by the last business day of June.
- 6. Exhibitors must arrive at the activity (Shoot) and be prepared to participate at designated. location, date, and time.
- 7. Exhibitors must supply their own equipment, firearms, and ammunition (Factory

only Ammunition, No Reloads). The Superintendent/RSO must approve all equipment prior to the start of the event.

- 8. The 4-H Shoot date is Sunday, July 28, 2024 beginning at 8 am. Location of Shoot is at Wolverton Mountain Gun Club. Mandatory judge's meeting and Fitting and Showing to begin at 8:30 a.m. Shooting to begin no sooner than 9:00 am and end when completed. Awards to follow when all events are concluded.
- 9. The Superintendent/Judge/RSO will have the final decision of any disputes.
- 10. Recommend bringing a sack lunch, snacks, and beverages.

DIVISION 705: RIFLERY SHOOTING SPORT STWEARDSHIP (NO PREMIUMS)

All exhibitors participating in the Riflery Division Shoot are required to do an hour or more of stewardship in the 4-H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area in South Hall 3.

Failure to do Stewardship during Fair will mean the member's premium will be withheld.

Sign-ups will be available on the day of the Fair Shoot.

- 1. Working with the public with hands on exhibits and education
- 2. Answering questions about the project and exhibits
- 3. Providing security for the exhibits

DIVISION 706: RIFLERY FITTING AND SHOWING (following Judges meeting)

Points: Blue 40, Red 30, White 15

A. Juniors: 8-10 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

B. Intermediates: 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

C. Seniors: 14-18 y years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

Exhibitors must participate in fitting and showing to shoot. Judge may automatically award a white ribbon for failure to properly handle equipment and/or demonstrate gun safety rules.

Rifle Fitting and Showing Exhibitors will be:

- Appropriately dressed and groomed.
- > Able to see target(s) without hats or hair blocking vision. No loose Jewelry.
- > Equipment will be clean and ready for firing.

- > Be able to demonstrate the proper handling of equipment.
- > Be prepared to answer questions on:
- Firearm Safety/ Range Safety
- 4-H Air Rifle, Muzzleloader, Shotgun, Smallbore Rifle. Material
- General questions from the Judge.
- The Clark County Fair 4-H Shooting Sports shall follow the guidelines for National 4-H
 Competitive Events as established by National 4-H Headquarters at the National Institute
 for Food and Agriculture (NIFA) of the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)

DIVISION 40: RIFLERY 4-H IN ACTION

- Members may sign up on July 30 at the Clark County Fair Grounds in the 4-H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area in South Hall 3 or when they sign-up for Stewardship times at the Fair Shoot.
- 4-H in Action can be done concurrently with the member's required Stewardship in the 4-H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area in South Hall 3.
- This is a non-judged activity that takes place on the 4-H stage in the 4-H Shooting Sports Still Exhibit area in South Hall 3. This activity is not as formal as a demonstration; however, the presentation should be planned and practiced. Individuals,

teams, and groups are encouraged to share an activity with the public. Information should be presented and questions answered.

Examples of activities that would work well in this type of presentation are: How to determine Eye Dominance, how to clean your equipment used (Example: muzzleloader, pistol, rifle, shotgun. No firearms are allowed in our area during Fair. Recommended using a Power Point and/or Display) going over the types of various types of firearms or ammunitions and their purpose, how to reload shotshells or brass (No powder or lead shot), demonstrate the various shooting positions and how they are used.

• You are responsible for providing all supplies and equipment necessary to complete your presentation.
