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ONLINE ENTRIES

Entries can be submitted online at <https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com> beginning on **May 1st, 2026**, and ending on **July 15th, 2026, at 10 p.m.**

When you enter your exhibits online, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entries will be received by the Premiums and Awards office, and your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been registered online must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

E-MAIL/MAIL ENTRIES

Fillable entry forms can be found at www.clarkcofair.com. Exhibitors can fill out their entry form and e-mail the completed form to premiumsandawards@clarkcofair.com. E-mailed entries must be received by the Premiums and Awards office by Friday, July 15th, 2026 at 2:00 p.m. Exhibitors can also mail entry forms to Clark County Fair, 17402 NE Delfel Rd, Ridgefield, WA 98642. Your entries will be entered into the online software by a staff member in the Premiums and Awards department. You will receive a confirmation e-mail when this has been completed.

When you enter your exhibits by e-mail, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been e-mailed must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

ENTRY FEES

An entry fee of \$5 per animal must accompany each animal entered.

Credit card payments:

When your entries are received, you will be sent an electronic invoice from Swipe Simple. The invoice can be received by email and/or text message. You will be able to pay your entries fees by credit card using the link in the electronic invoice.

ENTRY INFO

** Please notify the Superintendent via email to daniellegetz15@gmail.com of your entry and stall request to avoid unexpected entries that result in last minute stall changes. Ok to call, text, or email the Superintendent or the Assistant Superintendent.

STALLS

Stall assignments will be made based on seniority of participation at the Fair. Requests for specific stalls at the time of registration are encouraged but not guaranteed. Prior 4-H stall assignments may or may not be available for open class participants. Stalls should be decorated with farm sign/banners; and stall cards for each animal with picture, age/birth date, sex and clarify if llama or alpaca. It is also encouraged that you try to decorate within the specific theme of the Fair for the year. A minimum of two (2) animals per stall except for intact males will be followed. Based on availability, a maximum of two (2) stalls per exhibitor, if individual, and four (4) stalls per farm will be granted. Efforts will be made to use the same stall layout as during the 4-H portion though some changes may be necessary. These will be made as late as Tuesday evening at haul-in. Stalls are assigned by the Superintendent and may not be changed without prior approval from the Superintendent.

All classes will be held in the Llama Greenway area beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, **August 12**.

SPECIFIC RULES

1. Exhibitors must read the General Rules document that also contains the General Animal Health Requirements, available on the Fair's website.
2. Llamas/Alpacas must be in place by Wednesday, August 12 at 9 a.m.
3. There is a limit of two (2) entries per animal in a division except for Showmanship. If the same animal is entered twice in the same division, it must be two (2) different age divisions. (Example: if 'Adult exhibitor A' shows 'Llama A' in Trail, 'Youth exhibitor A' can also show 'Llama A' in Trail, but 'Adult exhibitor B' cannot).

4. The superintendent reserves the right to combine, change or cancel classes.
5. All display structures must be pre-approved by Superintendent and/or Fair Manager, depending on size and content.
6. There can be no substitute animals without prior approval.
7. Classes are based on the age and experience of the exhibitors and/or animal.
8. Exhibitors must supply their own water buckets, hay bag/bucket and stall cleaning tools. Local hay will be supplied by the Clark County Fair.
9. Shoes should be appropriate for the show ring (open toed shoes, sandals and bare feet will disqualify the exhibitor).
10. In all classes, all animals shall be presented for judging with a halter and lead rope with minimal adornments or decorations.
11. There shall be no ranch, personal, animal, organizational name, logo, or insignia displayed on the exhibitor or animal during any class.
12. The Superintendents may dismiss an exhibitor and/or their animal from participation in the show if the exhibitor mistreats their animal, or if their animal exhibits unruly or unsafe behavior.
13. For safety reasons, it is recommended that youth under the age of 12 not show intact males over the age of 24 months.
14. Exhibitors are limited to those who entered on an animal entry form by the deadline. There will be no substitute exhibitors without Superintendent approval, and only from those exhibitors who entered timely.
15. Premiums checks will be issued within 60 days after the end of the Fair. Checks not cashed within 120 days of issuance will not be replaced.

Division 100: Herdsmanship – Judged Participation

Wednesday, August 6 through Sunday, August 10

All exhibitors of open class llamas/alpacas are expected to participate in herdsmanship between the hours of **9 a.m. and 8 p.m.** Exhibitors are responsible for making arrangements to cover these hours, either themselves or by a competent representative. The purpose of herdsmanship is to present an attractive exhibit area; to provide educational information about camelids to the public; and ensure the cleanliness and care of animals and neatness of pens. Exhibitors will be judged on cleanliness of stalls, cleanliness and comfort of animals, identification of animals and handlers, quality of educational displays and exhibitor interaction with the public. Decorations should follow the annual theme of the Fair.

Division 200: Animal Registration/Entry Fee

The purpose of this division is to capture all animals entered in the 2026 Clark County Fair and to attach the entry fee of \$5 per animal to each animal. Please add one entry in Division 200 for each of the llamas/alpacas you will be bringing to the 2026 Clark County Fair. Attach one registered animal to each of your entries.

Entries in this division will not be shown or judged and will not receive ribbons or premiums for this division. This is for registration purposes only.

Division 201: Halter Class (Classes A-M)

Friday, August 14, 1:00 p.m.

Llamas/alpacas are compared and evaluated on their conformation, movement, wool quality, and temperament.

Division 202: Showmanship (Classes N-R)

Friday, August 14, 9:00 a.m.

Animal to be shown with halter and lead, to walk, pace, and stand for examination. Handlers are encouraged to wear white shirts or blouses with dark-colored pants or skirts. (Hobo Handler Class does not require dress code or extensive animal grooming but is limited to competitors over 18 years old.) Halters should be clean, fitted, and in good repair. Emphasis is given on the ability of handler to show their animal to its best advantage. Questions about animals and their care may be asked.

Division 203: Handler Class (Classes S-W)

Thursday, August 13, 9:00 am by appointment

A one-on-one event with Handler and animal in a stall with Judge. Handler answers questions and performs specific tasks related to safely handling their animal.

Division 204: Trail Obstacle (Classes S-W)

Saturday, August 15, following Random Draw Showmanship

Animals to compete through a planned course of up to 10 obstacles such as might be experienced on a trail hike. Obstacles may include, but are not limited to water, jumps, backing, maze, bridge, etc. Animals to be judged on willingness and skill.

Division 205: Public Relations (Classes S-W)

Sunday, August 16, 9:00 AM

Animals to compete through a planned course of up to 10 obstacles such as might be experienced at parades, schools, nursing homes, or public events. Obstacles may include, but

are not limited to balloons, loud noises, unexpected movements, or other animals, etc. The willingness of animal and handler will be taken into consideration.

Note: At 11:00 a.m. there will be a break of approximately one (1) hour during this course to attend 4-H Round Robin and cheer our llama/alpaca exhibitors.

*Experienced animal refers to one who has placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in a past show.

Division 206: Costume Class (No class/age division)

Wednesday, August 12 following Gambler's Choice (may move to Sunday)

A classic event where all participants dress themselves and their animal(s) in appropriately matching costumes and vie for top honors. There may be two (2) classes depending on participation: Youth (17 and under) and Adult (18+). A special award will be given to the most unique and/or complex costume. Ribbons will be awarded, but not premiums.

Division 207: Gambler's Choice (no class/age division)

Wednesday, August 12, 10:00 a.m.

A timed obstacle course with point values for each obstacle based on degree of difficulty. An initial attempt must be made in order, then all obstacles may be done more than once, in any direction, to accumulate the highest total points. No points will be given for incomplete attempts. No age or experience limitations. This is a timed event so some degree of coordination is recommended, and very young exhibitors/animals may have difficulty. Please do not enter an animal who cannot or will not complete obstacles. No ribbons or premiums will be awarded for this class, this competition is for bragging rights only.

Division 208: Random Draw Showmanship (no class/age divisions)

Friday, August 14, following Showmanship

A Showmanship event where exhibitors are randomly assigned someone else's animal for a Showmanship competition based on a drawing. Animals shown in this event are limited to those qualified to participate in Division 184 but may not necessarily be the same animal. It is allowed to show the same animal in both Division 184 and 185, at the exhibitor's discretion, but please be cognizant of the heat and your animal's ability. This division is limited to experienced exhibitors over the age of 12; experience refers to an exhibitor who has participated in Showmanship more than 3 times prior to entering this class regardless of their placing). This is one event, without separate age/experience classes/lots.

PREMIUMS: Flat ribbons will be awarded for 1st through 10th place unless otherwise stated.
