ONLINE ENTRIES

Entries can be submitted online at <u>https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com</u> beginning on May 1, 2025 and ending on July 25, 2025 for the first show and August 4, 2025 for the second show. When you create an online account, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entry will be received by the Premiums and Awards office and your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and provided to the department superintendent.

If you would like assistance with submitting your entries online, please contact the Premiums and Awards office at 564-397-3454.

IN PERSON ENTRIES

If you would rather not submit your entries online, you can submit your entries for the first show in person on Thursday, July 31, 10 am to 8 pm. You can submit your entries for the second show in person on Tuesday, August 5th, 5 pm to 9 pm, and Wednesday, August 6th, 7 am to 9 am. If you plan to submit your entries in person, you will need to contact the Fair Office after April 1st at (564) 397-6180 during regular business hours to request an Exhibitor Number.

ENTRY DROP OFF

Entries for the first show can be dropped off on Thursday, July 31st, 10 am to 8 pm. Judging starts at 7 pm. Entries for the second show can be dropped off on Tuesday, August 5th, 5 pm to 9 pm, and Wednesday, August 6th, 7 am to 9 am.

ENTRY PICK UP

First Show entries pick up August 5th from 4 p.m. to 9 p.m. Second show entries may be picked up at close of Fair 10 p.m. – 11 p.m. Most items will have been recycled due to exhibits condition and looks during the Fair. All entries are taken in at the North side of the Exhibition Hall Loading Dock Area; the far West garage door (Hall A) with Floral (look for signs directing you to the area). Let the gate attendant know that you are entering an exhibit and they will direct you to the parking area where you can enter your exhibit. Due to limited parking spaces time will be limited. Thank You for your understanding.

GENERAL RULES: See Clark County Fair General Rules.

SPECIFIC RULES

- 1. The Fair is not responsible for loss or damage, although care will be practiced.
- 2. Poor quality or diseased specimens will not receive awards even if competition is lacking. All exhibits to be grown or maintained by exhibitor during the current Fair year. Dried exhibits classes 132 & 314 must have been grown and dried by exhibitor after previous Fairs ending.
- 3. Judging will be by the Danish system.
- The superintendent reserves the right to add or subdivide classes. Exhibits will be discarded at end of show or when they become unsightly. <u>1st show entries must be picked up Tuesday</u>, <u>August 5, 5 p.m. - 9 p.m.</u> <u>Dried Exhibits may stay till end of Fair.</u>
- 5. All exhibits to have been grown or maintained by exhibitor. Except classes 228-232 may use items not grown by exhibitor to create these exhibits. Only one entry allowed per each class. All other classes may enter three (3) NAMED varieties or One (1) unnamed variety as stated per class requirements.
- 6. Tops cut to 2" on beets, carrots, onions, parsnips. Cabbage to have inside wrapper leaves intact. Onions to have at least one-layer wrapped leaves.
- Exhibits & ribbons can be picked up on Sunday, August 10, from 10 p.m. 11 p.m. or Monday, August 11, 2025, from 9 a.m. to Noon.1st show entries (see Rule 4).
- 8. No ribbons or exhibits may be removed early, or the premium will be forfeited.
- 9. Premiums checks will be issued within 60 days after the end of the Fair. Checks not cashed within 120 days of issuance will not be replaced.
- 10. Exhibitors must report errors in premiums paid within 30 days to Fair Office or no adjustment will be made.

Judging of the first show will begin at 7:00 p.m.

Judging of the second show will begin at 9:30 a.m. on Wednesday, August 6. All entries judged by the Dansh system. Judging is on quality, maturity, and uniformity (size, shape & color), damage (insects, disease, etc.) and preparation.

ENTER YOUR CREATIVE FUN WITH FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Express yourself in classes 228-232. Exhibit entries do not need to be grown or maintained by exhibitor. Don't let those wild and wacky fruits and vegetables in your garden go unrecognized.
