ONLINE ENTRIES

Animal Entries can be submitted online at https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com beginning on May 1, 2025 and ending on the last business day of June. 4-H Exhibitors: Please log-in to Fairentry with your 4-Honline credentials, you do not need to create an account to submit 4-H Exhibit entries. FFA and Grange Exhibitors: you must create a new account in Fairentry to submit entries. Your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and provided to the department superintendent.

GENERAL COMMENTS:

Each 4-H, FFA, Grange Youth member showing in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the general rules for the Clark County Fair located at the front of Exhibitor Handbook, the 4-H, FFA, or Grange Youth rules and regulations printed at the beginning of the 4-H, FFA, Grange Youth section, and the special rules and regulations of this department. Youth exhibitors must follow the Code of Conduct for their respective youth program and adhere to the IAFE Code of Show Ring Ethics. Any 4-H, FFA, or Grange Youth member showing in this department has the right to show or use in fitting and showing any domestic fowl as long as it is healthy, clean, and not in molt. However, the judging of the birds themselves will be done to the American Poultry Association and American Bantam Association Standards. Their disqualification rules will be applied to the birds. The superintendent has a copy of these rules for the members to see if necessary.

POULTRY RULES & REGULATIONS:

- 1. Entries must be received by the last business day of June to the WSU/Clark County Extension 4-H Program office. FFA members turn in all paperwork to the FFA Superintendent by June 1st. Grange Youth members submit all paperwork to the Grange Youth Project Leader by June 20th.
- 2. In filling out your entry form, please state your name, mailing address and a phone number where you can be reached in case of emergency.
- 3. Under "Name, Variety" list each bird's breed and variety.
- 4. Birds and crafts will be cooped in on Thursday, August 1, from 6 to 8:00 pm and on Friday, August 2 from 7 to 8 a.m. Birds must be in place by 8 am Friday, August
- 2. 5. Birds will not be accepted without a numbered leg band. The number must be listed on the entry form.
- 6. No bird will be shown in more than one division and class.
- 7. The bird must have been owned and cared for by the member since June 1 of the current 4-H/Grange year. The eggs must be from the member's birds. 8. Birds suffering from disease or external parasites on arrival will be refused entry by the superintendent or assistant superintendent.
- 9. Cloverbuds or Grange Youth ages 5-7 may enter birds in Conformation Judging and Showmanship and any other youth active listed below
- * Cloverbuds or Grange Youth ages 5-7 are excluded from doing mandatory herdsmanship; although they are encouraged to help as much as they are able.
- **Cloverbuds or Grange Youth ages 5-7 are not eligible for Premiums.
- 10. Birds for fitting and showing must be entered and shown in a division and class. All exhibitors must participate in the Fitting and Showing Contest.
- 11. The Standard of Perfection of the American Poultry Association and the American Bantam Association will be used as a guide for breed and variety characteristics.

4-H/FFA POULTRY HERDSMANSHIP DIVISION 100: 4-H/FFA/GRANGE YOUTH POULTRY HERDSMANSHIP

Superintendent Points on a Club Basis:

Points: Blue 30, Red 15, White 7.

Each exhibitor must attend our PRE-FAIR meeting. This meeting is typically held within 14 days prior to the fair (you will be given 2 months notice of the date). Exceptions may be made with the superintendent, but you will have the last pick of herdsmanship times if you do not attend this meeting.

Premiums for conformation will be withheld unless Poultry Herdsmanship is completed. Superintendent to determine the number of hours of herdsmanship per kid per day not to exceed two hours a day. Clover buds are excluded from the two hours of mandatory herdsmanship; but they are highly encouraged to help as much as they are able. Up to two information posters per club can add to the club average. (These information posters should be brought directly to the Superintendent.) Each member will be responsible for:

- 1. Personal appearance
- 2. Care of the department and birds
- 3. Public relations
- 4. Tasks given out by the superintendent

Clover buds and kids that would like help reading and/or writing will do the judging contest at 11:30 a.m. They will be assisted by the superintendent or a 4-H leader. Adding points from eggs, cut up parts, breed ID, Nomenclature, Oral reasons and knowledge test will determine the class champion for judging (award only).

DIVISION 433: One Bantam chicken, any breed recognized by the American Bantam Association (individual).

DIVISION 435: Ducks, any breed recognized by the American Poultry Association or the American Bantam Association.

DIVISION 436: Geese, any breed recognized by the American Poultry Association.

DIVISION 437: Turkeys, any variety recognized by the American Poultry Association.

DIVISION 438: Guinea Fowl, any variety recognized by the American Poultry Association.

Points: for Classes A-F: Blue - 10 Red - 8 White - 6

Participation in the Junior Livestock Auction

Participation in the Junior Livestock Auction is an option (not a requirement) for youth in the 4-H, FFA, and Grange programs. All Clark County youth (4-H, FFA, or Grange) participating in a market animal project with the intent to sell at the Junior Livestock Auction, are required to attend a Quality Assurance meeting by our species representative prior to receiving their market animals. Two dates will be provided for completion of this requirement. You only need to attend one. It is up to the species rep if additional dates will be added.

** You must contact the superintendent or species representative before MARCH 1st to be able to participate in the Junior Livestock Auction. . All Animals sold at the Junior Livestock Auction shall have passed the withdrawal period for administration for medicines, whether under veterinary care or not. It is the responsibility of each market animal exhibitor to ensure compliance with this rule. This rule exists for public health reasons. Violators are subject to disqualification of all prizes, awards, and premiums with potential suspension from 4-H FFA, and Grange Youth activities for a period determined by the Clark County Fair 4-H FFA or Grange Youth Grievance committee and potential civil or criminal legal action. All blue-ribbon animals are eligible for the JLA; however, only two lots are eligible to go through the Junior Livestock Auction. You may enter three lots total. Each member participating in JLA must do two hours of poultry herdsmanship a day during the 2nd half of the fair. This is in addition to herdsmanship required by the Poultry Superintendent during the first half of the fair. Youth must also do Poultry Fitting and Showing and complete the Knowledge Test during the first half of the fair. Juniors will only be allowed to enter chickens and ducks unless discussed and approved by species representatives and they can demonstrate appropriate handling of turkeys or geese.

Poultry singles and pens have no pre weigh-in but are weighed just before being shown. Chickens will be wing banded by species representatives. Geese and turkeys will be provided leg bands. If multiple kids show ducks, they will also be wingbanded otherwise leg bands are provided. Health records and expense records must be completed by the time of weigh in. All blue-ribbon singles and pens of chickens, ducks, geese, and turkeys are eligible for sale. Attendance at one of the two quality assurance meetings is mandatory for selling in the JLA.

Anyone enrolled in the Poultry/Pigeon project may take part in JLA for poultry. Individuals must complete the requirements for the project set forth by the Poultry/Pigeon superintendents. Individuals only doing pigeon showmanship will be required to do an extra showmanship with a Market species during the second half of Fair. No premiums or awards will be given in this showmanship competition. Bird may be a market animal, or another species of poultry recognized by the APA. Birds will be ordered and distributed by the Poultry Species representative.

Birds will be ordered and distributed by the Superintendent or assistants.

4-H/FFA/GRANGE YOUTH Market Cornish Cross: Single and Market Pen (3 birds). To qualify must be at least Six weeks old and weigh at least five pounds on August 6, 2025. Each chicken must be wing banded at two weeks of age. If re-banding is necessary, they must be re banded by the superintendent prior to the first day of the fair. Contact a superintendent immediately if a wing band is missing.

4-H/FFA/GRANGE YOUTH Market Duck: Single and Market Pen (3 birds). To qualify must be at least seven weeks old but no more than 10 weeks on August 6, 2025, and weigh at least six pounds. Wing banding or leg banding is up to the discretion of the species representative as set forth above..

4-H/FFA/GRANGE YOUTH Market Geese: Single and Market Pen (3 birds). To qualify

must be four to six months old on August 6, 2025, and weigh at least ten pounds. Birds must have leg bands on at weigh-in.

4-H/FFA/YOUTH GRANGE Market Turkeys: Single and Market Pen (3 birds). To qualify must be no less than 14 weeks old and no more than 18 weeks old on August 6, 2025. Toms must be at least 18 pounds; hens must be at least 13 pounds. Birds must have leg bands on at weigh-in.

4-H/FFA/YOUTH GRANGE Market Freedom Rangers: Single and Market Pen (3 birds) To qualify must be no older than 11 weeks and two days \ on August 6, 2025. Birds must weigh at least 5 pounds. Each chicken must be wing banded at two weeks of age. If re-banding is necessary, they must be rebanded by the superintendent prior to the first day of the fair. Contact a superintendent immediately if a wing band is missing
