## ENTRIES

No entry fees. Two shows. Entries are accepted for the first show Thursday, August 1, 10 A.M. to 8 P.M. Entries for the second show will be accepted Tuesday, August 6, 5 P.M. to 9 P.M. and Wednesday, August 7, from 7 A.M. to 9 A.M. All entries are taken in at the north side of the Exhibition Hall Loading Dock Area; the far west garage door (Hall A) with Floral (look for signs directing you to the area). Just tell the gate guard that you are entering an exhibit and they will direct you to the parking area where you can enter your exhibit.

## GENERAL RULES: See Clark County Fair General Rules.

## SPECIFIC RULES

1. The Fair is not responsible for loss or damage, although care will be practiced.
2. Poor quality or diseased specimens will not receive awards even if competition is lacking.
3. Judging will be by the Danish system.
4. The superintendent reserves the right to add or subdivide classes. Exhibits will be discarded at end of show or when they become unsightly. $1^{\text {st }}$ show entries must be picked up Tuesday, August 6, 5 P.M. - 9 P.M. Dried Exhibits maybe picked up end of Fair.
5. Only one entry per Class. Up to three (3) different herbs per entry allowed. All entries should have common name variety if known.
6. Tops cut to 2" on beets, carrots, onions, parsnips. Cabbage to have inside wrapper leaves intact. Onions to have at least one-layer wrapped leaves.
7. Exhibits \& ribbons can be picked up on Sunday, August 11, from 10 P.M. - 11 P.M. or Monday, August 12, 2024, from 9 A.M. to Noon. $1^{\text {st }}$ show entries (see Rule 4).
8. No ribbons or exhibits may be removed early, or the premium will be forfeited.
9. Exhibitors must report errors in premiums paid within 30 days to Fair Office or no adjustment will be made.

Judging of the first show will begin at 7:00 P.M. on Thursday, August 1.
Judging of the second show will begin at 9:30 A.M. on Wednesday, August 7.
Judging is on quality, maturity, and uniformity (size, shape \& color), damage (insects, disease, etc.) and preparation.
