ONLINE ENTRIES

Entries can be submitted online at <https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com> beginning on **May 1st, 2026**, and ending on **July 15th, 2026, at 10 p.m.**

When you enter your exhibits online, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entries will be received by the Premiums and Awards office, and your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been registered online must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

Your entries will be entered into the online software by a staff member in the Premiums and Awards department. You will receive a confirmation e-mail when this has been completed.

When you enter your exhibits by e-mail, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been e-mailed must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

WALK-IN ENTRIES

If you would rather not submit your entries in advance, you can submit your entries on Tuesday, August 4, Wednesday, August 5, and Thursday, August 6 from 11 am to 6 pm. Please only one horse per entry form.

ENTRY FEES

An early entry fee of \$10 per horse per class will be charged. The entry fee starting the first day of the Fair will be \$15 per horse per class. **Refunds will be given if excused from a division by the judge or by a veterinarian.**

Credit card payments:

When your entries are received, you will be sent an electronic invoice from Swipe Simple. The invoice can be received by email and/or text message. You will be able to pay your entries fees by credit card using the link in the electronic invoice.

Credit Card payments are also accepted at the Administration Office at the Clark County Fairgrounds. Please call (564) 397-6180 to make your payment by credit card.

STALL DECORATING

Stall decorating is encouraged. Stalls will be judged on Saturday and prizes will be awarded that day.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

Premiums will be paid for 1st through 4th place and ribbons will be given from 1st place to 6th place.

1st place - \$17, 2nd place - \$13, 3rd place - \$10, 4th place - \$5.

All High points receive trophies and grand and reserve grand champion ribbons.

Stall decorating encouraged. Ribbons to 6th Place, trophy to top display. Judged Saturday, August 8 (Judged on educational content, cleanliness, Fair Theme and overall appearance.) Inspirational Trophy awarded by Judge at End of Show.

Premiums checks will be issued within 60 days after the end of the Fair. Checks not cashed within 120 days of issuance will not be replaced.

SPECIFIC RULES

1. Exhibitors must read the General Rules document that also contains the **General Animal Health Requirements**, available on the Fair’s website.
2. The Horse Office will be open on Tuesday, August 4, Wednesday, August 5, and Thursday, August 6, 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

3. Admission is free for paid pre-registration prior to August 7. Pre-Registered Horses read **General Rules** for pass Information.
4. All times listed in the horse show schedule are approximate.
5. Horse Stalls
 - a. Stalls: \$10.00 per day. Stalls may need to be bedded because of prior horse shows. One bag per stall; additional bedding at \$10.00/bag.
 - b. Stalls are to be used for exhibits during the Clark County Fair.
 - c. All animals stabled must be shown.
 - d. All animals staying overnight must be stabled.
 - e. All stalls must be occupied during the rental period. Stall reservations will be paid in advance.
6. Halter Horses only may show out of trailer, but **vehicles must be off grounds before 10:00 AM.**
7. All horses must be examined and passed by the Vet check before showing or taken into barns.
8. Show attire required, and helmets recommended in all classes.
9. All parking locations, pattern of parking and the right to park in the horse area will be determined by the Light Horse Superintendent.
10. Any unauthorized parking could result in the removal of vehicles and trailers and elimination from the Fair.
11. Remember that dogs are not allowed on the fairgrounds. Exception: Service dogs and show animals.
12. Light Horse Superintendent reserves the right to cancel or combine classes in any horse show.
13. Light Horse Superintendent will excuse any horse and/or rider for animal abuse, profane language or other inappropriate behavior.
14. See individual sections for mandatory vet inspection times.
