The educational display can take the form of a poster, a tabletop display, a mobile or large display. Displays have less than 60 seconds to get their message across. Display may show any topic of an educational nature. The display may include sound, motion, etc.

PLEASE INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ON THE BACK OF YOUR POSTER:

4-H member's name

4-H project area (example dogs, dairy, rabbit)

4-H Level - Primary - Junior - Intermediate - Senior

IDEAS AND HELPFUL HINTS FOR YOUR POSTER:

Check your spelling

Have a title for your project

Have a 1-2 inch border

Be able to read text from 10 feet away (example ½" size letters)

This is not to be confused with the educational material and posters used in herdsmanship in the animal barns. Those are a group, club, or individual effort. An Educational Display is an individual effort.
