### ONLINE ENTRIES

Animal Entries can be submitted online at <https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com> ending on the last business day of June. Please log-in to Fairentry with your 4-Honline credentials, you do not need to create an account to submit 4-H Still Exhibit entries.

Each 4-H member showing in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the general rules of the Fair located in the Exhibitor Handbook, the 4-H rules and regulations located at the beginning of the 4-H section in the Exhibitor Handbook, and the special rules and regulations of this department. Times of shows may be changed under the superintendent's discretion. This may include reasons such as but not limited; weather, time of previous shows running longer than anticipated, etc.

### RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. All Entries must be submitted online in Fairentry and requests for stall space must be received by the last business day in June**
- All Lamas to be stabled at the Clark County Fair must be in place by Friday, August 7, at 8 am and remain in place until released by the Barn Superintendent at 5 pm, Tuesday, August 11 (Haul out terms will be discussed in further detail on Tuesday morning at the exhibitors award ceremony).
- Fitting and Showing is Mandatory to participate in other classes.
- Lamas must be shown with unornamented halter and lead.
- With the exception of the 4-H logo, **no advertising** or farm logos are allowed in the ring except for costume class.
- Exhibitors must show in neat clean attire - slacks or new jeans, white tee shirts, blouse or shirt. For performance classes, more casual attire is acceptable, but for safety reasons, **no bare feet** are allowed.
- Exhibitors must provide their own water buckets, hay, grain, and tack.
- To qualify for state fair, the fit & show animal must participate in both the showmanship division and a performance division.
- Parents, family members not enrolled in the lama 4-H program, public, etc, may not walk, hold lead, brush, clean your lama project during the duration of the 4-H portion of

the lama show. There are a few exceptions; during lama judging, we need adults to walk the animals being judged by the 4-H exhibitors, assisting in putting on costumes, and in emergency situations.

#### **4-H LAMA HERDSMANSHIP**

(Refer to information under Division 100)

Each individual is required to do herdsmanship. Failure to complete herdsmanship results in withheld premiums.

**Herdsmanship Premium is paid to the 4-H Club** Use Clark County Fair Livestock entry form to fill out Herdsmanship Premium request, with Club name as it appears on the club checking/savings account. Premium will not be granted without the submitted paperwork. Premium will be mailed in c/o General Club Leader

#### **4-H ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP** (Refer to Division 105)

Senior and Intermediate Champion and Reserve Champion Showmen are required to participate in the Round Robin Contest.

#### **DIVISION 416: 4-H LAMA SHOWMANSHIP**

**Saturday, August 8, 9:30 am**

Animals to be shown with halter and lead, at walk, trot, and stand for examination. (May include hands-on exam by Judge.) Seniors will show first, followed by Intermediates and then Juniors.

**Points: Blue 40, Red 30, White 15**

CLASS:

- A. Juniors 8-10 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- B. Intermediates 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- C. Seniors 14-18 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

#### **DIVISION 417: LAMA HANDLER**

**Friday, August 7, 9 am to 1 pm followed by Lama Social at 5 pm**

Handler and lama will be appointed a time slot to appear before the judge. Lamas will be judged on training and manageability.

Handler will be judged on proper handling, ease with animal, lama management, behavior, care, and the ability to answer questions as posed by the judge.

**Points: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10**

CLASS:

- A. Junior 8-10 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- B. Novice Lama Junior 8-10 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year.  
Animal **must** be a true novice animal. That means, never shown before at the Clark County Fair or placed a blue placing in any other fair or open show.
- C. Intermediate 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

- D. Novice Lama Intermediate 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year. Animal **must** be a true novice animal. That means, never shown before at the Clark County Fair or placed a blue placing in any other fair or open show.
- E. Senior 14-18 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- F. Novice Lama Senior 14-18 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year. Animal **must** be a true novice animal. That means, never shown before at the Clark County Fair or placed a blue placing in any other fair or open show.

#### **DIVISION 418: 4-H LAMA COSTUME**

**Saturday, August 8, following Lama Showmanship (Will start approximately 30 mins after showmanship. Time and date can change if high temperatures are occurring for the safety of animals and exhibitors.)**

Lama and 4-H handler to show in costume appropriate for age.

Lama must be well groomed, and costume must not jeopardize handler or lama's safety.

Costumes will be judged on creativity, complexity, theme, and age of handler. **Points: Blue 10, Red 8, White 6**

CLASS:

- A. Juniors 8-10 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- B. Intermediates 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- C. Seniors 14-18 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

#### **DIVISION 419: 4-H LAMA OBSTACLE COURSE (trail) Sunday, August 9, 9:30 am (Seniors will show followed by Intermediates and then Juniors.)**

1. Obstacles as encountered on the trail. Lamas may be asked to wear a pack.
2. Handler may show more than one animal in this class. All animals must be exhibitors own project animal. 4-H member may show multiple animals per class, providing that there is space at the Fair.
3. To qualify for the beginning animal class this should be the animal's first year showing. They will move up to the standard division the following year.
4. First year showmen have the option to show in the standard division at their discretion. Exhibitors have the option to show their beginning animal in the standard division at their discretion. However, experienced handlers and animals cannot be entered in the first-year handler or beginning animal classes.

**Points: Blue 20, Red 15, White 8**

#### **DIVISION 420: 4-H LAMA STRING-A-LONG**

**Sunday, August 9, Following Obstacle Course**

Trail obstacle course using two or more lamas as a string. 4-H member's project lama

must be the lead animal. Lead animal to wear pack frame or saddle with or without panniers.

**Points: Blue 20, Red 15, White 8**

- B. Intermediates 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- C. Seniors 14-18 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

### **DIVISION 421: LAMA PUBLIC RELATIONS OBSTACLE CLASS**

**Sunday, August 9, following Trail Obstacle Course Class**

**Show order is Seniors, Intermediates, Juniors**

Designed for the llama who may never see the open trail, but who participates in parades, school, and nursing home visits.

1. Obstacles to be encountered but not limited to balloons, ramps, loud noises, hospital beds, bicycles, etc.
2. Handler may show more than one animal in this class. All animals **must** be exhibitors own project animal. 4-H member may show multiple animals per class; providing that there is space at the Fair.
3. To qualify for the beginner animal class this should be the animal's first year showing. They will move up to the standard class the following year.
4. First year showmen have the option to show in the standard division at their discretion. Exhibitors have the option to show their beginning animal in the standard division at their discretion. However, experienced handlers and animals cannot be entered in the first-year handler or beginning animal classes.

**Points: Blue 20, Red 15, White 8**

- B. Junior 8-10 years of age – beginning animal and/or handler

### **DIVISION 422: 4-H LLAMA DRIVING**

**Sunday, August 9, 9 am**

Only one animal at a time in the ring for safety.

Llamas three years and older with cart and harness (Junior members may show older llama by ground driving if it is the first time in ring for llama.)

Animals younger than three years to be shown by ground driving.

Equipment must be clean and correctly used and harness must be in good repair.

Spoken commands may be used, but not shouting.

Llamas may be required to walk, turn, do a figure-8, stop and back up.

**DIVISION 423: 4-H LAMA SPECIAL TRICK (following Costume Class)**

**Saturday, August 8**

Ability of 4-H member and lama to perform an unusual or skillful trick. Safety of animal and handler and willingness of animal will be stressed. Lead rope, dressage whips or other prop as supplied by 4-H member are allowed. Voice commands only - no shouting.

**Points: Blue 10, Red 8, White 6**

- A. Juniors 8-10 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- B. Intermediates 11-13 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year
- C. Seniors 14-18 years of age by October 1 of the current 4-H year

**DIVISION 424: 4-H LAMA JUDGING CONTEST**

**Saturday, August 8, 4 pm**

Members will place groups of four items in order from best to least preferred. Judging can include llama conformation, fiber, tack, feed, equipment, and identification of body parts or equipment. A special award will be given to Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors for "Best Oral Reasons." EM4647 "Learning Through Judging"
