

OPEN CLASS RABBITS

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ONLINE ENTRIES

Entries can be submitted online at <https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com> beginning on **May 1st, 2026**, and ending on **July 20th, 2026, at 10 p.m.**

When you enter your exhibits online, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entries will be received by the Premiums and Awards office, and your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been registered online must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

E-MAIL/MAIL ENTRIES

Fillable entry forms can be found at www.clarkcofair.com. Exhibitors can fill out their entry form and e-mail the completed form to premiumsandawards@clarkcofair.com. E-mailed entries must be received by the Premiums and Awards office by Friday, July 20th, 2026 at 2:00 p.m. Exhibitors can also mail entry forms to Clark County Fair, 17402 NE Delfel Rd, Ridgefield, WA 98642. Your entries will be entered into the online software by a staff member in the Premiums and Awards department. You will receive a confirmation e-mail when this has been completed.

When you enter your exhibits by e-mail, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been e-mailed must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

ENTRY FEES

Entries must be accompanied by a non-refundable entry fee of \$1.00 per rabbit per division, and \$1.00 per meat pen. Rabbits entered in Division 280 will not pay an entry fee.

Credit card payments:

When your entries are received, you will be sent an electronic invoice from Swipe Simple. The invoice can be received by email and/or text message. You will be able to pay your entries fees by credit card using the link in the electronic invoice.

Credit Card payments are also accepted at the Administration Office at the Clark County Fairgrounds. Please call (564) 397-6180 to make your payment by credit card.

ENTRY RULES

1. All breeds with more than one variety, please state the variety or color in the entry description.
2. No rabbits allowed under 10 weeks (with the exception of the baby rabbit display).
3. The baby rabbit display is for display only; no premium points will be received. Baby rabbits must be between 3 – 6 weeks of age at the time of coop-in. Space is limited and must have superintendent's approval by **July 20, 2026**.
4. All rabbits must meet animal health requirements.
5. Rabbits may be limited on space availability and subject to Superintendent's approval. In the case of too many entries, a limit may be imposed.
6. Entry forms can be obtained at the Fair Office or online. Ensure the entry form is completely filled out with Entry type, Division, Class, Sex, Color/Variety, Ear Number, Junior or Senior stage of rabbit and whether you are showing as a Youth or Adult.
7. All rabbits will be accepted in the showroom from 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. on Thursday, August 6, 2026. There will be a health check upon check-in.

SPECIFIC RULES

1. Exhibitors must read the General Rules document that also contains the **General Animal Health Requirements**, available on the Fair's website.
2. This show is not sanctioned by American Rabbit Breeders Association however it will be following ARBA rules.
3. **American Rabbit Breeders Association Sanction Rules**

All entries shall be judged according to the Standards of the American Rabbit Breeders Association show rules including, but limited to the following:

- a. Section 16. All youth entries must be carried to the show table by youth. Exhibitors do not have to carry their own animals to the show table.

- b. Section 24. All entries are entered and shown at the risk of the owners, and while associations are expected to exercise all reasonable care in the handling and protection of the exhibits, such association will in no case be liable.
 - c. Section 26. All animals must be permanently and legibly earmarked in the left ear. Rabbits not legibly earmarked will be eliminated from the class. All rabbits shown must be purebred, no crossbreeds.
 - d. Section 29. The name(s) of each exhibitor shall be placed on exhibition coop cards.
 - e. Section 30. All entries, both adult and youth, must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor prior to the show.
 - f. Section 52. Youth exhibitors can enter sanctioned youth shows between the ages of five (5) and eighteen (18) year. An adult cannot show in youth classes at any time.
4. All exhibitors are required to do at least 4 hours of Herdsmanship. Additional shifts are encouraged. Sign up for Herdsmanship during check-in. Failure to do Herdsmanship will result in premiums being forfeited.
 5. All exhibitors are required to change pine shavings and clean and sanitize all Fair equipment upon coop-out on **Tuesday, August 11, 2026**. Premiums will be issued upon clearance from the superintendent.
 6. The Fair will provide feed and water cups. Exhibitors are allowed to bring your own water and feed containers, no water bottles please. Owners that are feeding their own animals must do so before 10 a.m. If animals are not fed by 10 a.m. Herdsmanship will feed them.
 7. Premiums checks will be issued within 60 days after the end of the Fair. Checks not cashed within 120 days of issuance will not be replaced.
 8. Exhibitors finding mistakes in premiums paid must report this mistake to the Clark County Fair within 30 days or no adjustment can be made.

Please contact the Superintendent by **July 20, 2026, if you wish to volunteer in the Rabbit Department during the Clark County Fair.**

Division 100: HERDSMANSHIP

Each exhibitor is responsible for decorating and maintaining their assigned pen space and aisle area. In addition, each exhibitor is required to do at least 4 hours of Herdsmanship. Additional shifts are encouraged. Sign up for a Herdsmanship shift during check-in. Failure to perform Herdsmanship will result in premiums being forfeited.

JUDGING

Judging will start at 2 p.m. **Saturday, August 8, 2026**. Exhibitors should be present and carry their rabbits to the judging table.

Division 251: Meat Pen

Consists of 3 rabbits of the same breed and variety, age limit 69 days, weight requirement is 3½ to 5½ pounds each animal.

Division 252: Single Fryer

Age limit 69 days. Weight requirement 3½ to 5½ pounds.

Division 253: Roaster

Under 6 months old, minimum of 5½ pounds and maximum of 9 pounds.

Division 254: Stewer

Must be over 6 months old and weigh over 8 pounds.
