

## OPEN CLASS QUILTS & NEEDLEWORK

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### ONLINE ENTRIES

Entries can be submitted online at <https://clarkcofair.fairentry.com> beginning on **May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2026**, and ending on **July 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026 at 10:00 pm.**

When you enter your exhibits online, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entries will be received by the Premiums and Awards office, and your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been registered online must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

E-mailed entries must be received by the Premiums and Awards office by **Friday, July 31<sup>st</sup> at 10 p.m.** Your entries will be entered into the online software by a staff member in the Premiums and Awards department. You will receive a confirmation e-mail when this has been completed.

When you enter your exhibits by e-mail, your Exhibitor Number will be assigned to you automatically by the online software. Your entry form and entry tags will be printed for you and will be provided to the department superintendent. Entries that have been e-mailed must be dropped off on the dates and times below.

### WALK-IN ENTRIES

Exhibitors can also submit entries in person on **Tuesday, August 4<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday, August 5<sup>th</sup> from 10 a.m. until 7 p.m.** No entries will be accepted on Thursday, August 6<sup>th</sup> or Friday, August

7<sup>th</sup>. If you plan to submit your entries in person, you will need to call the Fair Office at (564) 397-6180 during regular business hours after May 1<sup>st</sup> to request an Exhibitor Number.

### **ENTRY DROP OFF**

Entries can be dropped off on Tuesday, August 4 and Wednesday, August 5 from 10 a.m. to 8 p.m.

1. This Department is open to anyone who wishes to enter. No entry fee will be charged or admission tickets given to exhibitors.
2. Entries in this department must be home produced and entered in the name of the exhibitor. No entry that has been exhibited before can compete for premiums.
3. No hot glue items will be accepted.
4. All entries must be completed after August 11, 2025.

### **SPECIFIC RULES**

1. The **General Rules** are called to the exhibitor's attention. They are available on the Fair's website [www.clarkcofair.com](http://www.clarkcofair.com).
2. Only those items for which there is a Division and Class number can be entered. Entries are limited to 5 (five) in any one class per exhibitor. The "OTHER" class will be used if the item does not fit within any other class in a division.
3. No soiled or obviously used articles will be accepted. Soiled is defined as but not limited to, dirty, stained, fur/hair or odors such as but not limited to smoke, mildew, mold, etc. The superintendents reserve the right to reject such articles.
4. Exhibitors must ensure all items (accessories) on an exhibit(s) are securely attached.
5. No exhibits can be removed before 10 p.m., Sunday, August 16. If any article is removed prior to that time, the exhibitor will forfeit the ribbon and premium for such article.
6. After the Fair, exhibitors may pick up entries on Sunday, August 16 from 10 - 11 p.m. and on Monday, August 17, 2026, from 9 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. noon.
7. The Fair Board is not responsible for exhibits but will use every precaution to protect them from loss or damage.
8. The superintendents reserve the right to reject any articles for exhibit at their discretion.
9. The Superintendent(s), Assistant Superintendent(s) & judges reserve the right to transfer an entry/exhibit to the correct Division and/or Class.

10. Premiums checks will be issued within 60 days after the end of the Fair. Checks not cashed within 120 days of issuance will not be replaced.
11. Any mistakes in the premiums must be reported within 30 days after receiving your check to the Fair Management or no adjustment can be made. No checks will be issued or corrected after December 31, 2026.

### **SPECIAL AWARD, MADE FOR CHARITY**

Any item made for charity receives a special ribbon, no money awards. If you are entering your items in person, add the letter "C" to your entry form for each charitable contribution. Use a separate entry form for these items. If you are entering your items online, indicate your donation to charity in the item description. No limit to number of exhibits. Please include a label with the size for each garment.

If the exhibitor does not wish to receive a tax receipt, they may turn the items over to the department superintendent, who will donate the items after the conclusion of the Fair. These items become the property of CCF for distribution to Clark County non-profit agencies.

If the exhibitor wishes to receive a donation receipt for their items, they will need to take the item to a qualifying charity after the Fair and receive a tax receipt directly from the charitable organization.
