4-H/FFA/GRANGE YOUTH LIVESTOCK DIVISIONS:

Livestock Animal Possession and Certificates:

Beef: Must have been in possession of the exhibitor by the first weigh-in (first Saturday of February). The 4-H Beef Superintendent will collect 4-H certificates and give them to the WSU Clark County Extension 4-H Office the Monday following the pre-weigh-in. FFA members turn in certificates to the FFA Advisors. Grange Youth members turn in certificates to Youth Grange Project Leader.

Market Goat: Market Goat certificates must be turned into the WSU Clark County Extension 4-H Office April 1 of the current year. FFA members turn in certificates to their FFA Advisor. Grange Youth members turn in certificates to Grange Youth Fairs Program Leader.

Dairy: Dairy (cow and goat) exhibits must have been in the personal possession of the exhibitor since May 1 of the current year. Dairy Cow certificates must have been completed and on file in the WSU Clark County Extension 4-H Office or to the FFA Superintendent by the May 1 of the current year. FFA members turn in certificates to their FFA advisor.

Market Sheep: Must have been in possession of the Grange Youth exhibitor by the pre-weigh-in (second Saturday of June).

Market Swine: Must have been in possession of the Grange Youth exhibitor by the pre-weigh-in (first Saturday of May).

Small Animals: Poultry, Pigeon, and Rabbit exhibits must have been in the personal possession of the exhibitor since May 1 of the current year (market poultry and market rabbit should follow species' requirements for age of animals).

All FFA entry forms are due to the Advisor by **June 1st**

All Grange Youth entry forms are due to the Youth Grange Project Leader by June 20th of the current year.

4-H, FFA, Grange Youth members will compete by program in Fitting and Showmanship classes. Animals raised by 4-H, FFA, and Grange Youth will be shown together in type classes. For example, 4-H members will compete with only 4-H members and FFA members will compete with only FFA members in Fitting and Showmanship but animals raised by 4-H and FFA members will be shown together in a market or breeding class.

4-H State Fair Animal Projects: Paperwork for 4-H State Fair is due to the WSU Clark County Extension 4-H Program office by August 23, 2022. Clark County State Fair Superintendent Shelia Stuhlsatz 360-263-8176.

Grange Youth State Fair Animal Projects: Paperwork for Washington State Fair is due to the Youth Grange Project Leader within 10 days of the last day of Clark County Fair.
