4-H/FFA/Grange Youth Swine Department is divided into two sections, Breeding Swine and Market Swine. Breeding and Market Swine are exhibited August 10-14. Both sections hold separate shows for type. All 4-H, FFA and GRANGE YOUTH Swine animals must be in place by 9 am on Wednesday, August 10. These animals must remain on exhibit until 8 pm on Sunday, August 14 or until released by the Fair.

Each 4-H, FFA, and Grange Youth member showing in this department is responsible for reading and complying with the General Rules for the Clark County Fair, the 4-H or FFA/Grange Youth rules and regulations - the Clark County Fair General Rules and the 4-H or FFA/Grange Youth General Rules documents are available on the Clark County Fair's website, and the special rules and regulations of this department.

4-H Entry Forms must be received at the WSU/Clark County Extension Office by the last business day of June – 1919 NE 78 Street Vancouver, WA 98665. FFA members turn in all paperwork to the FFA Advisor by June 1st. Grange Youth entries are due to the Youth Grange Project Leader by June 20 of the current year.

4-H HERDSMANSHIP (Refer to information under Division 100)

Each individual is required to do herdsmanship. Failure to complete herdsmanship results in premiums withheld.

DIVISION 400: 4-H/GY SWINE FITTING & SHOWING

DIVISION 400: FFA SWINE FITTING & SHOWING

Breed and Finished Divisions: Friday, August 12 – Your Fitting and Show animal must be entered and eligible for a market class or breed class. Following 10 am Swine Breed Show Fitting and Showing will begin with Senior, Intermediate, and Juniors. All exhibitors must participate. Exhibitor must show their own animal unless there is an unforeseen incident preventing this requirement. Superintendent will make the final decision.

See general rules for Fitting and Showing. The 4-H/ FFA/ Grange Youth exhibitor **must** perform grooming of the project animal and Herdsmanship; this includes clipping and washing the animal. In cases where 4-H/Grange Youth exhibitors are too young and/or physically unable to do their own clipping, only currently enrolled 4-H/Grange Youth members may provide the needed assistance. 4-H exhibitors will wear white shirts and dark denim pants for the contest. FFA and Grange Youth members are expected to show their animals in Official dress.

Points: Blue, 40; Red, 30; White, 15

The age of all 4-H/FFA members will be as of October 1 of the current 4-H year.
The age of all Grange Youth members will be as of January 1 of the current year.

Class:

- A. Juniors 8-10 years of age (Grange Youth 9-10)
- B. Intermediates 11-13 years of age
- C. Seniors 14-18 years of age

Top Junior, Intermediate, and Senior showmen will each receive an award. Second place Junior, Intermediate and Senior showmen - ribbon only

Fitting & Showing: (Refer to 4-H DIVISION 400 AND GRANGE YOUTH DIVISION 530)

Points: Blue 20, Red 15, White 10

CLASS:

- A. Individual Finished Hogs, and breed or cross-breed (220-300 pounds)
Champion and Reserve Champion - ribbon only
Top Rate of Gain receives an award.
- B. Feeder Hogs, between 40 and 160 pounds
- C. Light Finished Hogs, between 161 and 219 pounds
- D. Heavy, Heavy Weight Finished Hogs, over 300 pounds

GRADE Market Ready: Hogs of superior or greater conformation and cutability, that are acceptable in leanness, muscularity and production traits. BLUE RIBBON

NOT Market Ready: Any hog of average or below average conformation including US #3, #4, and utility grade hogs. RED RIBBON* *Red Ribbon swine can also be defined as "U.S. Utility- All barrows and gilts with probable unacceptable quality of lean or belly thickness will be graded U.S. Utility, regardless of their muscling or estimated backfat thickness over the last rib. Also, all barrows and gilt which may produce soft and/or oily fat will be graded U.S. Utility."

Participation in the Junior Livestock Auction

Participation in the Junior Livestock Auction is an option (not a requirement) for youth in the 4-H, FFA, and Grange Youth programs. All Clark County youth (4-H, FFA, or Grange Youth) participating in a market animal project with the intent to sell at the Junior Livestock Auction, are required to be certified in the Youth for the Quality Care of Livestock program. Exhibitors not currently certified in YQCA will not be eligible to sell through the Junior Livestock Auction. All

Animals sold at the Junior Livestock Auction shall have passed the withdrawal period for administration for medicines, whether under veterinary care or not. It is the responsibility of each market animal exhibitor to ensure compliance with this rule. This rule exists for public health reasons. Violators are subject to disqualification of all prizes, awards, and premiums with potential suspension from 4-H, FFA, or Grange Youth activities for a period determined by the Clark County Fair 4-H, FFA or Grange Youth Grievance committee and potential civil or criminal legal action.

All swine not intended for the auction must be declared no later than 6 pm the evening of the Finished Hogs show.

Qualification for the JLA:

Market Hog: (Market Gilt or Barrow)

Pre-weigh-in: May 7, 2022 – maximum 3 animals per exhibitor
Youth Quality Care Animals (YQCA) must be completed by pre weigh-in.

Final weigh-in: August 10, 2022 – maximum 2 animals per exhibitor

- Animal must meet rate of gain (ADG 1.3 lbs./day)
- Minimum weight: 220 pounds
- Maximum weight: exhibitor paid to maximum 290 lbs.

Compete and grade in market class as 1 or 2: Blue or Red ribbon only

Exhibitor allowed to sell 2 animals. Notify the species superintendent which animal will be sold as part of the JLA following the finished Hog (type) show.

Family Back-up Animal:

Immediate family members may register the same back-up animal, not to exceed the maximum animals per exhibitor in each species (Beef & Hog 3, Sheep 4). The family back-up animal must be identified and recorded appropriately at the initial specie weigh-in. Family back-up animals are limited to one per family. Exhibitor must notify the Specie Superintendent at final weigh-in their intention to show the family project.
